Clinical Assistant Professor in Counseling Psychology University of Florida, Department of Psychology

Description

The Department of Psychology at the University of Florida is seeking applications for a Clinical Assistant Professor in Counseling Psychology to begin August 16, 2021. This is a full-time, nine-month, renewable, non-tenure track position. The salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience and includes a full benefit package. The successful applicant will be expected to demonstrate inclusive excellence in teaching and mentoring at the undergraduate level and a strong commitment to helping shape culturally competent future psychologists at the graduate level as well as the development and implementation of initiatives that promote the program's core values of diversity, equity, and inclusion.

The position entails teaching Assessment I and Assessment II in the APA accredited Ph.D. counseling program, as well as other core clinical courses to be determined but likely to include Diagnosis and Treatment Planning. The successful applicant will be expected to demonstrate excellent clinical and assessment skills and the interest and ability to teach clinical skills via the aforementioned courses to graduate students in Counseling Psychology. The position will also entail teaching an undergraduate section of Abnormal Psychology or related topics. Additionally, the position involves serving as a core member of the Counseling Psychology faculty, including attending meetings and participating in area and departmental service activities. Some additional duties could include taking on administrative duties around training, which would correspond with a reduction in undergraduate teaching.

The Counseling Psychology program has been continually accredited by the American Psychological Association since 1954. The faculty currently consists of seven tenured or tenure accruing core faculty members, and the program admits approximately 6 Ph.D. students per year. The program atmosphere is collegial and cooperative, and students and faculty share a commitment to social justice.

Qualifications

By the time that the job commences, applicants should have completed a Ph.D. in Counseling Psychology or related field from an APA-accredited program and obtained licensure as a Licensed Psychologist in the State of Florida (strongly preferred) or be license eligible.

Please explicitly address how your clinical and assessment experience prepares you for teaching Assessment I and Assessment II and other courses related to clinical training. This statement should include the candidate's experience, interests and/or goals in fostering Ph.D. student's clinical and assessment skills via the aforementioned

coursework, as well as the candidate's commitment to fostering the cultural competence of graduate and undergraduate students.

- 4. A diversity statement addressing how your teaching, clinical, and service activities are in line with the program's core values and how they may enhance diversity, equity, and inclusivity in the program.
- 5. Names and contact information for three individuals that may be contacted to provide references.

To ensure full consideration, application materials should be received by **Sunday March 14, 2021**. Review of applications will begin after March 14 and will continue until filled.

The selected candidate will be required to provide an official transcript to the hiring department upon hire. A transcript will not be considered "official" if a designation of "Issued to Student" is visible.
