Course Requirements

This course is meant to be a support for the 1st time instructors teaching PSY2012 in honing their teaching skills, expanding their pedagogical and content knowledge, and dealing with varied teaching tasks. As such, it is an S/U course. Students are required to participate in all the following activities to receive a final satisfactory grade. Excuses will be accepted as needed.

• Participate in item development and finalization for each chapter (1=S; 0=U)

Writing good test items is a crucial skill for instructors. We will review basics on how to write good test items and put them into practice. There are 16 chapters in total. For the most of the weeks, GIs will come together to write test items (2 items or so per chapter), revise and finalize items in class. These items, together with some items from previous cohorts, will become question banks for the textbook chapters that GIs can use for their own quizzes. Some items may also be selected for midterm or last exams. Items should not be redundant. This means, if one GI already has posted an item on a concept from a section of the chapter, please write your item from another section or on another concept. Each section of the chapter should be covered by the test items unless otherwise notified. Therefore, post your items earlier than later!

• Participate in pedagogical discussions (1=S; 0=U)

Pedagogical discussion in this sense refers to topical discussion as planned or informal free communications about

- a. muddiest points in the textbook content,
- b. struggles and triumphs in lecture presentation, classroom management, interaction with students, etc.
- c. Issue resolution discussion (e.g., parents wants to meet to discuss student's performance, student pleading for make-up, honorlock issues, etc.)
- d. other topics as needed

As the 1st time GIs, everything is new and this is the activity designed to support GIs' teaching efforts. Each GI will take turn to lead the sharing and other GIs and I will provide feedback, recommendations, etc.

• Participate in data tracking (1=S; 0=U)

The Psychology Department expect the coordinated general psychology program to be a rigorous program with each section in the coordinated general psychology program to have 20-30% of final A (90% and up) by the end of the semester. To meet this departmental expectation, we track basically each section quiz and exam performance to help adjust as needed. Data tracking report will be posted at 5 occasions: post Quiz 2, Post Mid-term, Post Quiz 3, Post Quiz 4, Post Last exam.

• Lecture demonstration (1=S; 0=U)

I will observe each GI's classroom teaching (either live or recorded) and provide feedback on teaching. Graduate instructors will upload the lecture PPT as well as the self-rating form on teaching. I will attend the live or recorded class meeting, review the PPT, rate the lecture, and meet with the GI with specific feedback. See CANVAS for assignment details. Each GI needs to be observed once. Secondary lecture demonstration with feedback is upon request.

• Writing Assignment Completion (1=S; 0=U)

For GIs with more than one writing assignment, draft of the additional writing assignments need to be submitted via bootcamp training site by 1/16 with the revised version due 1/30.
