Course Requirements

This course serves as a support system for first-time graduate instructors (henceforth referred to as "GIs") teaching PSY2012. Throughout the semester, GIs will hone their teaching skills, expand their pedagogical and content knowledge, and fulfill various teaching tasks. PSY6940 is an S/U course; GIs are required to participate in all class activities to receive a final satisfactory grade. University-approved absences will be accepted as needed.

Requirements:

1. Participate in item development and finalization for Ch. 1-15 question banks. (1=S; 0=U)

The ability to write quality test items is a crucial skill for instructors. We will review the basics on how to write good test items and put them into practice. Our text has a total of 15 chapters. Each week this semester, GIs will write test bank items (2 per chapter). During weekly Zoom meetings, we will discuss, revise, and finalize each GI's items. These items (together with items from previous cohorts) come to form the question banks for each textbook chapter that GIs can use to create their quizzes. Some items from these banks may also be selected for the midterm and/or last (final) exam. **Items should not be redundant**. Thus, if one GI has already posted an item for a particular concept/section of the chapter, you need to write your item from a *different* section or on a *different* concept. For this reason, it is recommended that you post each week's items sooner rather than later! Overall, our test bank items should address **every** section of **every** chapter unless otherwise notified.

2. Participate in pedagogical discussions. (1=S; 0=U)

"Pedagogical discussion" in this sense refers to any topical discussion as planned, or informal free communications about:

- a. muddiest points in the textbook content
- b. struggles and triumphs in lecture presentation, classroom management, interaction with students, etc.
- c. issue resolution (e.g., parents want to meet to discuss student's performance, student pleading for an ineligible make-up, etc.)
- d. other topics as needed

As first-time GIs, everything is new; this activity is designed to support GIs' teaching efforts. GIs will take turns in leading this discussion once during the semester; other GIs and I will provide feedback, recommendations, etc.

3. Participate in data tracking. (1=S; 0=U)

The UF Psychology Department expects the coordinated general psychology program to be a rigorous program. Practically-speaking, this translates to each section in the coordinated program having **20-30% As** (90% and up) on instructors' final grade rosters at the end of the semester.

To meet this departmental expectation, we track each PSY2012 section's quiz and exam performance; this gives us the chance to adjust as needed (e.g., providing a post-quiz or exam extra credit opportunity, or perhaps adjusting quizzes to a higher level of difficulty). Data

tracking will occur on six occasions over the course of the semester:

- After Quiz 1
- After Quiz 2
- After the Midterm Exam
- After Quiz 3
- After Quiz 4
- After the Last (final) Exam

4. Lecture demonstration (1=S; 0=U)

I will observe each GI's classroom teaching (either live or recorded) one time during the semester and provide feedback. Graduate instructors will upload the corresponding lecture PPT and a self-evaluation form following the observed lecture. I will attend the live or recorded class meeting, review the PPT, rate the lecture, and meet with the GI to give specific feedback. See the Canvas for assignment page for more details. Although each GI only needs to be observed once this semester, a second lecture demonstration with feedback may be possible upon request.

5. Writing Assignment Completion (1=S; 0=U)

For GIs with more than one writing assignment, drafts of the additional writing assignments need to be submitted via our Bootcamp Training Canvas shell. The assignments must be revised and finalized according to the due date specified in the class schedule table below.
