## Assistant Instructional Professors (2) in Psychology

### **JOB DESCRIPTION**

The Department of Psychology at the University of Florida is seeking applications for two Lecturer (working title Assistant Instructional Professor) positions in psychology to begin August 16, 2023. These positions are full-time, nine-month, renewable, non-tenure track position. The Department of Psychology is dedicated to promoting diversity, multiculturalism, and inclusion. We particularly value candidates who engage students within and outside the classroom.

Although the area is open for both positions, preference will be given to candidates who are able to teach general courses in our Behavioral & Cognitive Neuroscience undergraduate track and/or Developmental Psychology, Research Methods, and other core courses. Successful candidates must also be willing to coordinate/supervise graduate students teaching a general psychology course. In addition, applicants are expected to demonstrate a commitment to excellence in teaching and mentoring a diverse undergraduate student population.

The University of Florida is ranked the 5th best public university and the 2nd ranked fully online Psychology Program in the United States by US News and World Report 2022, with exceptional research, teaching, and a university-wide commitment to diversity.

#### Qualifications

Applicants should have a PhD in Psychology by the start date of August 16, 2023.

e) Statement on commitment to diversity in teaching and mentoring

f) Examples of a syllabus and an assignment or assessment you have used in your teaching

g) The names and email addresses of three references must be provided. An email will be sent to your references, requesting them to upload their confidential letter to the submission packet.

Note that all application materials will be evaluated for contributions to diversity, equity, inclusion, and excellence.

Review of applications will begin **December 1, 2022** and will continue until the position is filled. The salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience and includes a full benefits package.
